#### Stonehenge





# Experience Salisbury

Salisbury is a wonderfully intimate city, set in beautiful Wiltshire countryside. Five rivers, the Cathedral Close, medieval buildings, green spaces and water meadows.



#### St Thomas's Church

An ancient Medieval Church in the heart of the city including the remarkable Doom Painting over the Chancel Arch and other interesting treasures.



#### Salisbury Museum

Recently voted a 'hidden gem of a museum' – discover 500,000 years of history in an impressive medieval building in the Cathedral Close.



#### **Arundells**

Former Prime Minister, the late Sir Edward Heath's home in the Cathedral Close with some parts dating back to the 13th century – presented today largely as it was when he lived there.

#### Salisbury Guildhall

Built in 1795, a prominent building with an oak court modelled on the Old Bailey, overlooking the Guildhall Square.



#### **Mompesson House**

A homely and welcoming 18th century town house in the heart of Salisbury's Cathedral Close. Owned by the National Trust, the house has featured in many classic period dramas.



#### The Rifles Berkshire and Wiltshire Museum

Discover over 200 years of the history of county regiments, housed in a listed building known as the Wardrobe, in the Cathedral Close.



#### **Charter Market**

This historical outdoor market has been held on the Market Square on Tuesdays and Saturdays since the Royal Charter of 1227.



#### **Fisherton Mill**

Gallery, Cafe, Studio and Shop in an atmospheric setting within a historic converted grain mill.



#### Salisbury's Indies

Over 200 independent shops offering food, drinks, original arts and crafts, entertainment and much more.
