Salisbury Rediscovered

Salisbury has been welcoming visitors since 1227. A wonderfully intimate city, set in beautiful Wiltshire countryside. Five rivers, the Cathedral Close, medieval buildings, green spaces and water meadows – Salisbury is a city on a human scale, a city made for exploring.

Alongside the cathedral and museums, visitors benefit from a thriving cultural scene, a busy Charter Market and a panoply of independent retailers and creators.

Location

Salisbury is located close to both the coast and countryside; the New Forest is just 30-minutes from the city and offers a protected forest with roaming ponies, deer and cattle; Dorset is an hour drive and provides access to Bournemouth and the stunning Jurassic Coast with 250 million years of the earth's history to discover.

Welcoming groups

Salisbury is a friendly city, welcoming visitors and your travel team. Coaches and minibuses can drop off close to the Cathedral and city centre in St John's Street, alternatively the purpose-built 24-hour coach park at Millstream has 23 spaces and is just a 5-minute walk into the city centre. Salisbury Rediscovered is a two-day, one night itinerary during Spring – Summer 2024 for organised tours, including a behind the scenes tour at Salisbury Cathedral's library, a visit to the reimagined Salisbury Museum and time to enjoy one of the oldest Charter Markets in Britain.

Enjoy a 'Beyond the Library Doors' tour of Salisbury Cathedral's library, built in 1445 and home to a priceless collection of books, a tour of the reimagined Salisbury Museum, an evening performance of The Mousetrap 70th Anniversary Tour and experience a living history event like no other at The Wardrobe, the Rifles Berkshire and Wiltshire Museum.

Day 1

The first thing you'll see as you arrive is Salisbury Cathedral's spire, the tallest in the country. Standing at a breath-taking 404ft / 123m, it has been guiding travellers to Salisbury city for nearly 800 years. Drop off is in St John's Street, a short walk to Salisbury Cathedral.

Enjoy a fascinating glimpse into **Salisbury Cathedral's** past on a **'Beyond the Library Doors'** tour. Built in 1445, the Library contains nearly 200 manuscript books, some over 1,000 years old, and around 12,000 early printed books. Climb the winding stone staircase to the Library, situated above the Cloisters, where you will be shown a range of handwritten and printed books, specially selected to demonstrate the importance and variety of the collection. Before you head to your next place of interest, take some time to unwind at the Cathedral's **Refectory Restaurant**.

Your next stop is **Salisbury Museum**, reimagined in 2023-24 as part of the NLHF Past Forward Project where you can visit the museum's new galleries including the Devenish Bradshaw Salisbury Gallery, Ceramics Gallery and Natural History Gallery, or head over to **Mompesson House**, a quintessential eighteenth-century townhouse located in **The Close** where you can learn all about 'The Invisible Hands of Mompesson House'. End your day with a visit to **Salisbury Playhouse** and celebrate 70 years of **Agatha Christie's The Mousetrap**, the world's longest-running play.

Day 2

Salisbury is a modern medieval city and offers visitors an experience like no other. Today includes a visit to The Wardrobe, a military museum where you can experience a 'Living History' event along with time to explore the Charter Market, dating back to 1227.

Today begins with a visit to **The Wardrobe, the Rifles Berkshire and Wiltshire Museum**, the only military museum in Salisbury. With a range of 'Living History' events throughout the summer. Visit during the weekend of 6th - 7th July and see **The First World War** brought to life or on the 10th – 11th August for the **Festival of Living History**, where you will experience a military re-enactment like no other. After all that excitement take a quiet moment in the garden and then refuel at **The Rifleman's Table**, popular with locals.
