Welcoming groups


Salisbury is a friendly city, welcoming visitors and your travel team. Coaches and minibuses can drop off close to the Cathedral and city centre in St John's Street, alternatively the purpose-built 24-hour coach park at Millstream has 23 spaces and is just a 5-minute walk into the city centre.

Salisbury's Green and Open Spaces is a two-day, one night itinerary during Summer 2024 for organised tours, including a brand-new art exhibition in the Cathedral and time to explore Salisbury's beautiful gardens, walks and outside spaces.

Enjoy a visit to Salisbury Cathedral's new art Exhibition, 'Our Earth', alfresco English afternoon tea with the best view, an evening of theatre set in a historic garden, a stroll around our beautiful Queen Elizabeth Gardens, a photo opportunity of Salisbury Cathedral from either the spot made famous by the painter Constable or from the river Avon, and time to enjoy the best independent retail for miles around.

Day 1

The first thing you'll see as you arrive is Salisbury Cathedral's spire, the tallest in the country. Standing at a breath-taking 404ft / 123m, it has been guiding travellers to Salisbury city for nearly 800 years. The Coach drop off point is in St John's Street, a short walk to Salisbury Cathedral.

Salisbury Cathedral is hosting a new art exhibition,
Our Earth, exploring the domestic effects of climate
change and how our day to day lives may be impacted.
This new art exhibition will focus on the air we breathe,
how the landscapes are changing and the effect on our
homes that keep us safe and the food we enjoy. The
exhibition is curated by Beth Hughes, Salisbury Cathedral's
Visual Arts Curator. And then over to the Bell Tower Tea
Rooms to enjoy afternoon tea with magnificent views of
Salisbury Cathedral.

Visit **Queen Elizabeth Gardens**, opened in the 1960s to commemorate our late Queen's Coronation, perfect for a gentle stroll by the River Avon, or if you're looking for a great vantage point to take that memorable photograph, either head along the Town Path for the **Constable Walk**, where you'll be rewarded with the famous view of the Cathedral Constable painted or perhaps enjoy **a punt on the River Avon** and let yourself drift down the river and see the beautiful historic city of Salisbury from the water.
